Why choose Iran

Iran is one of the great, classic civilizations comparable in Asia only to China. It is a country which has acted as a cultural and spiritual bridge astride some of the world's most important trading routes between the East and West. On the other hand, Iran has been victim of a geography that has made it a target of foreign invaders, and subject to more invasions and destructions than most other nations.

Marked by remarkable natural contrast, Iran is bound on the north and south by two bodies of water, the Caspian Sea and the Persian Gulf. It is boarded on the east by Afghanistan and Pakistan, on the west by Turkey and Iraq, and on the northeast and northwest by the five newly independent republics of Central Asia.

Today, Iran is a booming and developing country, rich in natural resources, having a young educated population and highly sophisticated technological capabilities opening new horizons to economic, business and investment opportunities.

Visitors to Iran can receive the friendliness and welcome which come as a surprise after over two decades of less than agreeable newspaper headlines, and see some of the greatest sights in all Asia, such as the astonishing royal city of Isfahan—one of the most splendid monumental cities of the world—with its magnificent piazza, the World Heritage Site of Naqsh-e Jahan Square housing three renowned monuments representing the climax of Islamic architecture of the 17th Century Persia, or the silent ruins of the World Heritage Site of Pasargadae, the first Persian capital built by Cyrus the Great whose tomb is situated in the windswept upland plain surrounding the city, and the 6th Century BC World Heritage Site of Persepolis, a colossal stage on which Achaemenids displayed the glories of Ancient Persia.







Whilst the revolution has brought about great changes, the essentials remain unchanged: the timeless landscapes, the villages, distant caravanserais and immense vaulted bazaars, paradise gardens, turquoise domes and priceless carpets, and the cultural heritage that includes not only outstanding architecture but also the poetry of Hafez, Saadi, Ferdowsi and Omar Khayyam.
